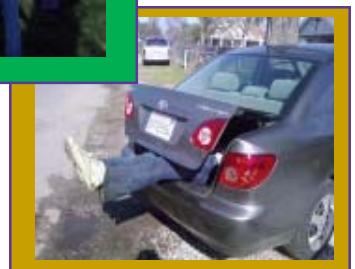
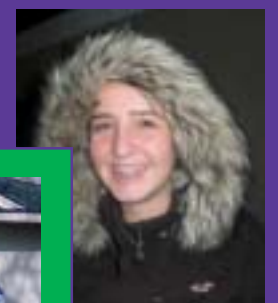
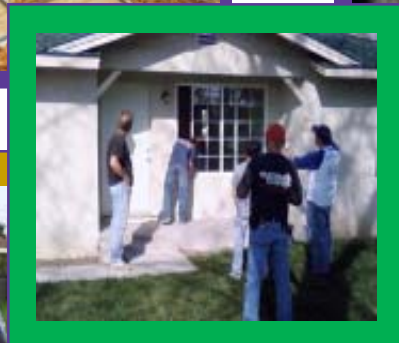
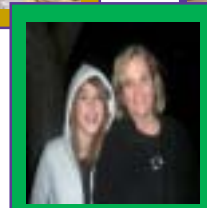
Natalie
